AGED FARMER'S WALK IS FATAL

Casper Schaden Dies of Apoplexy While Coming to Green Bay.

DEATH OVERTAKES HIM
WHEN HE STOPS TO REST

Well Known Pine Grove Man Starts for City and Is Seized by Fatal Attack Resulting from Exertion of Walking—Physician Is Delayed.

Death came in a strange and unexpected form yesterday to Casper Schaden, 65 years old, who lived near Pine Grove and was well known throughout a large part of the county. While on his way to Green Bay, after having covered four miles of the distance on foot, he stopped at Eisenman's saloon at Forks, about four miles east of this city. He ordered

a drink and as he was in the act of lifting the glass from the bar he suddenly threw up his hands, complaining of a sudden pain in the back of his head. As he clasped one hand to the back of his head he sunk heavily to the floor.

The attack seized him at 2 o'clock and after that time he failed to rally, death occurring about 9 o'clock last evening.

Dr. A. W. Slaughter, who was called from this city pronounced death due to apoplexy. Dr. Slaughter experienced considerable difficulty in responding to the call. He started to drive to Forks with a single rig and when a short distance from the city found the snow drifts so deep that he was unable to go farther. He returned to the city and after telephoning a statement of his dilemma to Forks a double rig was sent to this city and hurriedly conveyed the physician to the patient.

When he arrived at Forks he immediately saw that Mr. Schaden was beyond medical aid.

Mr. Schaden walked from his home to the Hagemelster stock farm in Bellevue, where he started to ride to this city. It is believed that the unusual exertion brought on the fatal shock.
